

William Scott Green is Senior Vice Provost and Dean of Undergraduate Education at the University of Miami. He has overall responsibility for enhancing the quality of the undergraduate experience and strengthening the integration of university-wide undergraduate curricular and co-curricular initiatives. He also holds an appointment as professor of religious studies and senior fellow in the Sue and Leonard Miller Center for Contemporary Judaic Studies.

Green is among a group of American educators working to expand entrepreneurship into university-wide education. He conceived, instituted, and, with Susan Wills Amat, co-founded The Launch Pad. Green was a member and then as chair of the Kauffman Foundation Panel on Entrepreneurship Curriculum in Higher Education. He currently serves as Senior Program Consultant for the Kauffman Foundation's Kauffman Campuses Initiative, which supports the development of cross-campus entrepreneurship programs in 18 colleges and universities. He has participated in panels and workshops on entrepreneurship education at various American universities and, as a member of US Department of Commerce delegations, in Peru, Denmark, India, Brazil, and China. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the National Association for Community College Entrepreneurship (NAACE).

Green came to the University of Miami in 2006 from the University of Rochester, where was Dean of the College and also served as director of the University's Center for Entrepreneurship. He chaired Rochester's Kauffman Entrepreneurial Year Program, which provides a tuition-free

fifth year of education to students engaged in a project in the study or practice of entrepreneurship.

Green earned an A.B. in religion at Dartmouth College and a Ph.D. in religion from Brown University. He has held fellowships from the National Endowment of the Humanities, the American Council of Learned Societies, and the Andrew Mellon Foundation.
